Rise ABOVE Melbourne hits the roof

It's been closed to the public for 100 years, but now the stunning vantage point atop Melbourne's Royal Exhibition Building is open. After years of restoration and building works, visitors can finally explore the iconic building and take in the views of Melbourne city and beyond from the newly re-established Promenade deck. Built in 1880, with a Dome based on the design of Brunelleschi's Duomo in Florence, the Royal Exhibition Building was the first Australian building to be awarded a UNESCO World Heritage listing.
